"The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act, 20 U.S.C. 1092) was originally enacted as Title II of the Student Right-to-Know and Campus Security Act of 1990 (P.L. 101-542); it was signed into federal law as an amendment to the Higher Education Act of 1965. The Clery Act was enacted to increase the accountability and transparency of Institutions of Higher Education (IHEs) in meeting certain responsibilities with regard to the safety and security of students on their campuses. It required IHEs participating in HEA Title IV financial assistance programs to disclose campus crime statistics and security information." (Library of Congress - History of the Clery Act: Fact Sheet)

The Clery Act requires institutions of higher education to disclose statistics for reported crimes based on **where** the crimes occurred, to **whom** the crimes were reported, the **types** of crimes that were reported, and the **year** in which crimes were reported.

WHAT'S IN THIS REPORT

The purpose of this report is to provide current and prospective students, faculty, and staff with campus safety information including crime statistics and crime reporting procedures.


GEOGAPHY - REPORTING LOCATIONS


On Campus: Any building or property owned or controlled by an institution within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area and used by the institution in direct support of, or in a manner related to, the institution's educational purposes, including residence halls; and Any building or property that is within or reasonably contiguous to the area identified in paragraph (1) of this definition, that is owned by the institution but controlled by another person, is frequently used by students, and supports institutional purposes (such as a food or other retail vendor).


Student Housing: Any student housing facility that is owned or controlled by the institution, or is located on property that is owned or controlled by the institution, and is within the reasonably contiguous geographic area that makes up the campus is considered an on-campus student housing facility.

Public Property: All public property, including thoroughfares, streets, sidewalks, and parking facilities, that is within the campus, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from the campus

Non-Campus: Any building or property owned or controlled by a student organization that is officially recognized by the institution; or any building or property owned or controlled by an institution that is used in direct support of, or in relation to, the institution's educational purposes, is frequently used by students, and is not within the same reasonably contiguous geographic area of the institution.







REPORTING CRIMES

Definition of "Privacy" versus "Confidentiality"

North Country Community College offices and employees who cannot guarantee **confidentiality** will maintain your **privacy** to the greatest extent possible. The information you provide to a non-confidential resource will be relayed only as necessary to investigate and/or seek a resolution and to notify the Title IX Coordinator or designee, who is responsible under the law for tracking patterns and spotting systemic issues. North Country Community College will limit the disclosure as much as possible, even if the Title IX Coordinator determines that the request for confidentiality cannot be honored.

Privileged and Confidential Resources

Individuals who are *confidential* resources will not report crimes to law enforcement or college officials without your permission, except for extreme circumstances, such as a health and/or safety emergency. Even individuals who can typically maintain confidentiality are subject to exceptions under the law, including when an individual is a threat to him or herself or others and the mandatory reporting of child abuse.

Behavioral Intervention Team

North Country Community College believes in coordinating care for our students. Documenting behavior before it becomes a policy violation is just as important to us as documenting when regulations are broken. Members of the Behavioral Intervention Team on each campus attempt to intervene early with at risk students, which helps connect students to support services, make appropriate referrals on and off campus, and cultivates wise choices and developmental growth. We ask faculty, staff, and students to reporting concerning behavior they observe or students in need of additional support using the secure webform located on www.nccc.edu/campus-safety/ by clicking **File a Report.** From there, the dynamic reporting form can be selected to "Refer for Student Support." Referral requests can also be made in person to any member of the Student Affairs team.

Cases are managed by the Interim Associate Vice President of Student Affairs who tracks outreach and referrals for students of concern. Common referrals include counseling services, Learning Assistance Center support, the Athletic Mentoring Program, ADA 504 accommodative services, emergency funding, and other social services to meet basic needs.

College Safety Committee

It is the policy of the State University of New York (SUNY) to comply with legal requirements of Article 129-A of NYS Education Law §6431 (Regulation of Conduct on Campus and Other College Property Used for Educational Purposes). Accordingly, the SUNY Board of Trustees has adopted written rules requiring campuses to establish campus safety advisory committees.

North Country Community College maintains an active College Safety Committee responsible for annual review of current campus security policies and procedures and annual recommendations for improvement to College administration. Specifically, the committee shall have responsibility to review policies and procedures for (1) educating the campus community, including security personnel and those persons who advise or supervise students, about sexual assault pursuant to §6432 of Article 129-A of NYS Education Law; (2) educating the campus community about personal safety and crime prevention; (3) reporting sexual assaults and dealing with victims during investigations; (4) referring complaints to appropriate authorities; (5) counseling victims; and (6) responding to inquiries from concerned persons. Membership of the committee consists of the faculty, staff, and students with representation from all campuses and all genders.

The Campus Safety Committee is currently chaired by the Student Life Coordinator on the Malone Campus, Bruce Kelly. Committee Composition is a minimum of six members wherein (1) at least half of the committee shall be female; (2) one-third of the committee shall be appointed from a list of

students that contains at least twice the number to be appointed, which is provided by the largest student governance organization on the campus; (3) one-third of the committee shall be appointed from a list of faculty members that contains twice the number to be appointed, which is provided by the largest faculty organization on the campus; and (4) one-third of the committee shall be selected by the president.

A self-audit of our compliance with NYS Education Laws 129 A and B are conducted annually each May and certificates of compliance are submitted by July 1 each year.

Policy on Timely Warnings

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off campus, that, in the judgment of the NCCC Administration or designee, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide "timely warning" will be issued. The warning will be issued through the college e-mail systems to students, faculty, and staff).

Depending on the particular circumstances of the crime, especially in all situations that could pose an immediate threat to the community and individuals notices will be posted in each residence hall, at the front door of everyone on campus building. Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the Associate Vice President of Student Affairs (518.891.2915 ext. 1205).



POLICY: Timely Warning and Emergency Notification

DRAFTED: February 2021 ADOPTED: May 27, 2021

I. POLICY STATEMENT

North County Community College, sponsored by Essex County and Franklin County, is part of the State University of New York (SUNY) system. The establishment of personnel policies is the responsibility of the North Country Community College Board of Trustees, while ensuring compliance with those policies is the responsibility of the College administration. We maintain and affirm that the most equitable and fair policies are those that involve shared governance, and we are committed to engaging the College community in the development/modification of established policies wherever possible. This policy follows that process.

This policy establishes and describes the College's formal written guidelines pertaining to Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications, including those specifically required by the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act (Clery Act) of 1990.

II. SCOPE

It is the policy of North Country Community College to alert the campus communities to certain crimes and safety/security issues occurring on one of our three campus locations, or in the immediate vicinity of these campuses. Generally, this area will include the streets adjacent and/or adjoining campus property. However,

nothing in this policy is intended to prevent notifications about incidents occurring outside of this area when they are likely to have a significant impact on members of the college community.

III. POLICY

Alerts are required for all incidents that constitute Clery Act Crimes and are considered to represent a serious or continuing threat to the campus community. These crimes include: Murder and Non-Negligent Manslaughter, Sex Offenses, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Burglary, Motor Vehicle Theft, Arson, and Hate Crimes.

Alerts may also be issued for: Crimes other than "Clery Act" crimes that pose a serious or continuing threat to the campus community (e.g. kidnapping or bomb threat), and non-criminal emergencies that pose a significant or continuing threat to the campus community or a segment of the campus community (e.g. weather related emergencies, maintenance issues, environmental health and safety issues, etc.).

Emergency Notifications are required for all significant emergency or dangerous situations that pose an immediate threat to health or safety of some or all of the members of our campus communities (e.g. an armed intruder is present in a campus building, several random arsons have occurred in a single night in occupied areas on campus, etc.).

Emergency Notifications may be labeled Crime Alert, Safety Alert or Emergency Notification.

Employees or students who learn of information which may warrant the issuance of a "Crime Alert," "Safety Alert," or "Emergency Notification" should notify the Administrator-on-Call as soon as possible.

IV. DEFINITIONS

Types of Alerts:

- Crime Alert A campus-wide notification regarding a crime determined to present an ongoing or continuing threat to the safety of the campus community.
- Safety Alert A notification issued under circumstances which may or may not be criminal in nature but still pose a significant or continuing threat to the campus community or segments of the campus community. Safety Alerts are not always issued campus-wide and may be issued selectively to affected areas.
- Emergency Notification A notification issued for a significant emergency or dangerous situation that poses an immediate threat to the health and/or safety of some or all of the members of our campus locations.
- Information Bulletin An informational notice regarding incidents that may not pose an immediate or continuing threat but are serious enough in nature that it is deemed appropriate that the campus community or a segment of the campus community should be informed.

V. REPORTING RESPONSIBILITIES

Alerts and Notifications are issued at the discretion of the following authorized title holders:

• College President (or Executive Assistant to the President)

- Associate Vice President of Student Affairs
- Director of Human Resources
- Vice President of Academic Affairs
- Vice President of Enrollment and Marketing
- Communications Director
- Chief Financial Officer
- Executive Director of the Association (re: Association housing)

Any College personnel who learn of information or recognize an event which may warrant the issuance of an alert or emergency notification must notify the Administrator-on-Call as soon as possible.

Those authorized to issue alerts will determine the type of alert to issue and the dissemination method. Dissemination methods may include but are not limited to the following:

- Campus-wide email
- College website / social media
- Alert poster or flyers
- SUNY NY Alert (Everbridge)
- Homepage
- On/off campus media releases
- Student Portal
- Blackboard

VI. INVESTIGATION AND RESPONSE PROCEDURES

The team of authorized personnel will determine if sufficient and accurate information exists to warrant the issuance of an alert.

When issuing an alert or emergency notification, authorized individuals will include the following, as appropriate:

- Title: Crime Alert, Safety Alert, Emergency Notification, Information Bulletin
- Authorizing authority
- Date of issuance
- Date, time and location of offense or situation
- Description of crime or situation
- Description of suspects
- Suspect's direction and mode of travel when fleeing incident
- Safety instructions/advice

The person who initiates an alert, emergency notification or bulletin will document the alert in College's incident reporting software including uploading a copy of the exact alert/bulletin. The Associate Vice President of Student Affairs will be responsible for reviewing the report for accuracy and will then preserve and archive the report in the current case management software.

If it is determined that the College's Emergency Response Plan should be activated, the reporting administrator (or designee), will call a meeting of the Emergency Response Team.

VII. FOLLOW-UP

Following resolution of an emergency notification, a follow-up alert will be sent to notify the College community that the emergency or threat is over. The same communication channels may be used as during the initial alert.

Law Enforcement

The College maintains excellent working relationships with our three Village Police Departments in Saranac Lake, Malone, and Ticonderoga as well as the New York State Police. Memorandums of Understanding are in place to ensure smooth communication and mutual cooperation. North Country Community College does <u>not</u> currently employ campus security guards.

I. Emergency & Fire Safety Equipment

- a. Proper use and response to fire alarms is required. **Disciplinary action will be taken against anyone who** falsely, intentionally, or negligently tampers with or activates fire safety equipment.
 - i. Fire safety equipment includes smoke/heat detectors, sprinkler heads, fire extinguishers, pull stations, alarm panels, and exterior doors. Disciplinary action will be taken against anyone who fails to respond to a fire alarm under any circumstances (drill, false alarm, etc.)

II. Fire Alarm Procedures

- a. All residents must exit the building. Use only stairs during a fire alarm. If you have difficulty exiting the building during an alarm, please contact a member of the Residence Life & Housing Professional Staff.
- b. Close your door. Don't forget your keys!
- c. Dress appropriately.
- d. Evacuation & Muster Point
 - i. Franklin Hall, Essex Hall & High Peaks Hall will evacuate the buildings to the cul-de-sac at the end of the parking lot or to Saints Hall.
 - ii. Saints Hall will evacuate to the entrances of Essex Hall
 - iii. Residents should not gather in the parking lot as emergency response vehicles will need access to the residence hall facilities.
- e. Do not re-enter the building under any circumstance until the "all clear" is given from the Residence Life & Housing Staff/Professional Staff On-Call/Fire Department
- f. Residence Life Staff have the authority to perform room inspections for people and policy violations during a drill.
- g. There will be a minimum of two (2) scheduled fire drills per building per semester.

III. Fire Safety Precautions

- a. No ceiling area in any room or suite may be covered with any poster, lights, tapestries etc. Curtains, tapestries, etc. or other room divider is prohibited.
- b. All posters, tapestries, and other wall hangings must cover only one wall and cannot be affixed on two or more walls
- c. No materials, liquid or otherwise, of an explosive or combustible nature shall be kept on the premises.
- d. Halogen lamps are strictly prohibited within the residence halls.
- e. Residents may only have 25% of your wall space covered.
- f. Residents are limited to one (1) tapestry per room. Tapestries must be fire retardant prior to hanging, and a resident must be able to provide proof to Residence Life staff that this has been done (either documentation to certify fire code compliance or proof of the fire-proofing product that was used).
- g. Candles, incense, lamps with plastic shades and lava lamps are not permitted within the residence halls.
- h. Appliances must have an automatic shut off feature. No appliances with an open flame or exposed heating coil are allowed in the residence halls.
- i. Holiday/decorative lights are permitted, but must be turned off when the room is vacant and must be LED.
- j. Any items that are found to be in violation of Residence Life Policy will be confiscated and stored until the resident goes home, at which time, it can be retrieved from Residence Life staff.
 - i. If something is confiscated from a room/suite, a note will be left indicating what was confiscated and why.
 - ii. All confiscated items need to be claimed by the end of the semester during which they were confiscated. Failure to claim/take home confiscated item(s) will result in that item or items being discarded or donated

IV. Smoking/E-Cigarettes

- a. Smoking and the use of e-cigarettes and/or vapors in public buildings, which includes College facilities and college affiliated residential buildings is strictly prohibited. An "e-cigarette" is defined as: an electronic device that provides a vapor of nicotine or other substance and which simulates smoking through its use or through inhalation of the device. It is an oral device that is composed of a heating element, battery, or electronic circuit and marketed, manufactured, distributed, or sold as an e-cigarette; e-cigar; e-pipe; or any other produce name or descriptor.
- b. The NCCC Association Residence Hall property is 100% Tobacco-Free. Smoking is also prohibited within 25 feet of any entrance or ventilation access of any building on any College site.

From Residence Life & Housing Staff Manual -

Fire Safety Procedures

- 1. A drill will be held at least twice per semester per building. A report is to be completed for each drill and is to be maintained by the Office of Residence Life & Housing.
- 2. Staff will do their best to hold drills on nicer days during the winter months.
- 3. All students along with any guests must evacuate the building every time the fire alarm sounds.
- 4. Families and guests of staff members must also clear the building when the alarm sounds.

Fire Evacuation Procedures

The following procedures should be followed <u>any</u> time the fire alarm sounds. Each residence hall has its own fire evacuation plan and these procedures should be placed on the back of each student's door.

Residents should:

- 1. Feel door edges for heat. If the door feels hot, do not open it.
- 2. If the door does not feel hot, open the door cautiously standing behind it when you open it (have the door between you and the hallway).
- 3. Close the door after you leave.
- 4. Leave the building by the nearest exit (leave at a brisk pace without running).
- 5. Clear and move away from the building. Students should gather near the dumpster in the cul-de-sac.
- 6. Do not return to the building until the "all clear" is given.

If you are not in your room, when the alarm sounds, proceed directly to nearest exit. Do Not Return To Your Room.

During A Drill: Residence Life & Housing Staff Members should:

- 1. Check rooms to be sure all are vacated
- 2. Close doors as leaving each room
- 3. Inform Profession staff present and/or On-Call when building is cleared.
- 4. Join other residents to help maintain order
- 5. Try to account for students in each building to ensure all occupants have left.
- 6. Fill out fire log for each building that a drill was held for

Activated Fire Alarm: Residence Life & Housing Staff Members should:

- 1. Obtain Fire Keys and Master Key(s) from Saints Hall
- 2. Guide residents and guests to evacuation locations
- 3. If flames are visible immediately notify the Director of Residence Life & Housing and the Profession Staff Member On-Call
- 4. If flames are not visible, attempt to locate where the alarm was initiative from the Fire Department will ask about this information
- 5. Meet the first responders from the Fire Department and hand the Fire Keys and Master to them they will be the point person at this time
- 6. Assist the members of the Fire Department as needed
- 7. Join other residents to help maintain order
- 8. Tri to account for students in each building to ensure all occupants have left
- 9. Notify the Professional Staff On-Call that the alarm was activates if they are not on scene or previously notified
- 10. Fill out Fire Log and Incident Report for the building that was impacted

In the event of an alarm sounding that is not planned, Resident Assistants do <u>not</u> check rooms and should evacuate the building and call the Emergency Availability person and report to them upon their arrival on scene.
