

## **SUMMARY:**

The North Country region still has the highest positivity rate (6.2%) in the state. Please continue to wear your mask and self-screen for any COVID-19 symptoms. If you have symptoms, do not come to campus, and please contact your health care provider.

## **BOOSTER SHOT UPDATE:**

Studies show that after getting vaccinated against COVID-19, protection against the virus may decrease over time and be less able to protect against the Delta variant.

Data from a small clinical trial show that a Pfizer-BioNTech **booster shot increased the immune response** in trial participants who finished their primary series 6 months earlier. With an increased immune response, people should have improved protection against COVID-19, per the CDC.

Currently, only certain populations initially vaccinated with the Pfizer-BioNTech vaccine can get a booster:

- 65 years and older
- Age 18+ in long-term care settings
- Age 18+ who have <u>underlying</u> <u>medical conditions</u>
- Age 18+ who work in <u>high-risk</u> settings
- Age 18+ who live in high-risk settings


